

List of Information Needed to Complete a Power of Attorney

- ❑ Name, personal details, and contact information for the person you wish to appoint as your attorney
- ❑ Enduring Power of Attorney—do you wish this person to continue making decisions for you even if you become bankrupt, or mentally incompetent
- ❑ Representation Agreements—there are two types of representation agreements: limited, which covers straightforward, everyday decisions; and general, which allows the appointed attorney to deal with complex legal, personal care, and health care matters. General agreements are needed for your representative to make decisions such as refusing life support if you become terminally ill
